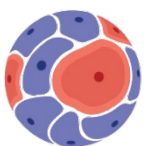

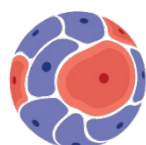

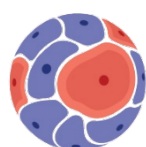

- Transport in Dublin

Single tickets can be purchased at individual train stations, tram stops or on buses. Buses only take coins and do not give change. A “**TFI Leap Card**” (<https://about.leapcard.ie/about>) that can be presented on buses, trains (DART/Iarnrod Eireann) and trams (Luas). - Traveling to the Venue

Buses are the main transport link to DCU, with bus stops at the Helix (bus route 44), on the Ballymun Road (8 min walk from The Helix - bus routes 4, 9, 11 and 13), and on the Swords Road (20 min walk from The Helix – bus routes 1, 16, 31D, 33, 41ABC, 42D).

Taxis are available from the city centre and through apps including Free Now and Uber (only taxis can be booked through Uber in Ireland).

Car parking is available at the DCU multi-storey car park, accessible from the Collins Avenue entrance. It has a 5 Euro per day rate and tickets will be available from the **Helix Café Bar from 1pm to 2 pm only. Please purchase these tickets** as standard parking fees will exceed 5 Euro.
